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Impact of the Fiscal Crisis: \$1.9 Billion in Program Cuts From Fiscal 2001 to 2003

According to the Foundation's detailed new analysis of spending changes from fiscal 2001 to fiscal 2003, the state has reduced expenditures in a host of specific programs by \$1.9 billion over the last two fiscal years. The reductions -- a 24 percent decrease from actual 2001 spending in the affected programs -- do not include the additional spending cuts that will be needed to deal with a \$2.5 to \$3 billion budget gap in fiscal 2004.

While almost all areas of government have seen major reductions since 2001, overall spending is actually up by just over two percent, largely because of the skyrocketing costs of health care. Among the programs with increased spending over the last two years, two-thirds of the \$2.4 billion, or 17 percent, increase has been concentrated in health care. Despite significantly reducing reimbursement rates to providers and dropping tens of thousands from the rolls, the costs of

Medicaid and other health care programs have risen roughly 15 percent a year, on average, since 2001 (see Table 1).

MTF's analysis compares actual program spending in fiscal 2001 to estimated spending in 2003; the program-byprogram results of the analysis are detailed in the accompanying attachment. This comparison takes into account the increases and reductions incorporated in the initial 2003 budget as well as the "9C" cuts implemented by Governors Swift and Romney and supplemental spending in 2003. It is important to emphasize that the reductions represent real cuts from the 2001 spending amounts; accounting for inflation and growth in client populations in 2003 would increase the size of the cuts.

These results provide a broader context for evaluating the various 2004 budget proposals, including the House Ways and Means Committee's revisions to Governor Romney's budget plan that are scheduled to be released tomorrow. If anything, the depth of the cuts to date only underscores the message of the Foundation's recent report on state spending, *The Perfect Storm...Unleashed*: The state's leaders face immense difficulties in resolving the current crisis that will require a comprehensive, multiyear solution.

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¹ The major reductions to the Medicaid program in 2003 took effect on or near April 1, including the elimination of coverage for the long-term unemployed and several "9C" cuts. The three-month impact of these cuts on 2003 spending is reflected in the "Total" line of Table 1 and in the attached detailed analysis; the annualized impact of these cuts, which will not be fully felt until fiscal 2004, is shown in the "Grand Total" line of Table 1.
