


UNDERSTANDING THE SURTAX, SPENDING, AND THE STATE BUDGET

Income Surtax Revenue Collections

- FY 2024 is the first full fiscal year in which the income surtax has been collected.
- The Department of Revenue originally projected that the surtax would generate between \$1.6 to \$2.1 billion.
- Through April, surtax collections have totaled \$1.84 billion, and they are projected to reach approximately \$2 billion by the end of the fiscal year.



What is the Income Surtax Spending Cap?

In the FY 2024 budget, lawmakers established a process to collect, track, and spend income surtax revenues.

The surtax spending cap is a limit on the amount of surtax revenue that can be used to support education & transportation priorities each year.

Purposefully setting a cap that is lower than projected collections ensures that the amount of surtax spending in the operating budget each year will be sustainable over the long-term.

The surtax spending cap for FY 2024 was set at \$1 billion.

What Happens to Above-Cap Income Surtax Revenue?

In the FY 2024 budget, policymakers also created a process to collect and appropriate "above-cap" surtax revenues.

With this structure, surtax revenues remain available to support critical priorities, without jeopardizing the structural balance of the state budget.
